2020 Objectives for this Ministry:

- Advertise and publicize St. Matthews community, fund raising events and special church services to exceed 2019 fund raising totals. persuasive

Team Accomplishments Since Last Report (accomplishments since May 11, 2020):

Done in Area of Communication:

- Angelica developed and distributed an email blast for
 - Drive up for Holy Communion - The Feast of Pentecost 5/31/2020
 - Drive up for Holy Communion & Food Drive 6/7/2020
 - Litany Included for Seventh Sunday of Easter 5/24/2020
 - Do you have a 2020 Grad? (two email blast distributions)All email blasts also include: Links to view the Live Mass via Facebook Live, link to retrieve the Liturgical aid, line to view the live mass via zoom; notice for food drive schedule; and announcements for other virtual events (Bible study Group, Rosary Group, Prayer Group, and Saint Matthew CommUNITY communication Page); Options for Giving notice; links to website, Instagram, and Facebook
- Deacon Tammy solicited volunteers for May 17th Saint Matthew Food Drive.
- Susan uploaded to May 12 Parish Council minutes to website and May CPRM ministry report to website.
- Susan gathered information from two .gov websites regarding "church re-opening after COVID-19 closures" and forwarded links and info to clergy and staff.
- Communication Susan completed to Saint Matthew community for purposes of "staying in touch" during the "shelter in place" mandate: Sent 10 birthday cards to all Saint Matthew June birthday celebrants. Kathryn Tuma provided the list. Susan forwarded a pdf copy of LA Times Article (May 20, 2020) - - "U.S. believers see message from God in virus crisis" to 16 recipients.
- Susan created posters to announce new guidelines for in-person church attendance. Stephany translated this announcement poster into Spanish. Will be duplicated to 16" x 20" size for mounting on church entrance doors.

Done in Area of Advertising:

- Nothing done in this area.

Done in Area of Facebook / Instagram:

- Stephany is posting clergy photos with a bio in Facebook and Instagram titled, "Getting to Know Saint Matthew's Clergy". Fr. Arturo's "spotlight" is complete. Stephany built a "Spotlight Tracking" sheet in Google docs; identified "active" vs. "inactive" clergy; and collect all relevant email addresses.
- Deacon Tammy posted an "event" on Facebook for the "Drive-by Holy Communion"
- Deacon Tammy posted photos of the May 17th Food Drive. Moving forward, Stephany will post a food drive flyer, at the beginning of each month on Facebook & Instagram.

Done in Area of Public Relations / Membership:

- Sharon is working with Jason Adams to produce two additional sandwich signs. Jason has purchased supplies for the two additional sign boards and should complete them by next week (week ending June 12).

Done in Area of Website:

- Justin built a new webpage to "Celebrate 2020 Graduates". Bob Morano and Susan collected names and information for this page, based on email blast distributed by Angelica. Webpage will be announced in email blast. Published on June 5th.
- Justin added a few more photos to the Weddings webpage.
- Bob Morano collected Quinceanera photos from Stephany Cristantos. Justin uploaded these photos and others to the Quinceanera webpage. Stephany created a narrative for this web page that included history, traditions, and information about the QUINCEAÑOS celebration. This narrative was written in Spanish for the Hispanic audience. Justin will add it to the webpage.
- Justin built and published the new Clergy Council / Pastoral Team webpage. Susan retrieved photos from website "media library" and Facebook for new Clergy Council/Pastoral Team webpage. Justin contributed additional photos. Susan distributed emails (to individuals whose photo was not available) requesting recipients respond with photos for this page. This email was preceded by a "proposal email" to secure permission from Deacon Tony. The Clergy Council Agreement placing Fr. Arturo as interim pastor was made available on this new webpage.
- Susan sent announcement to clergy and parish council members on June 1st announcing the new Clergy Council / Pastoral Team web page.

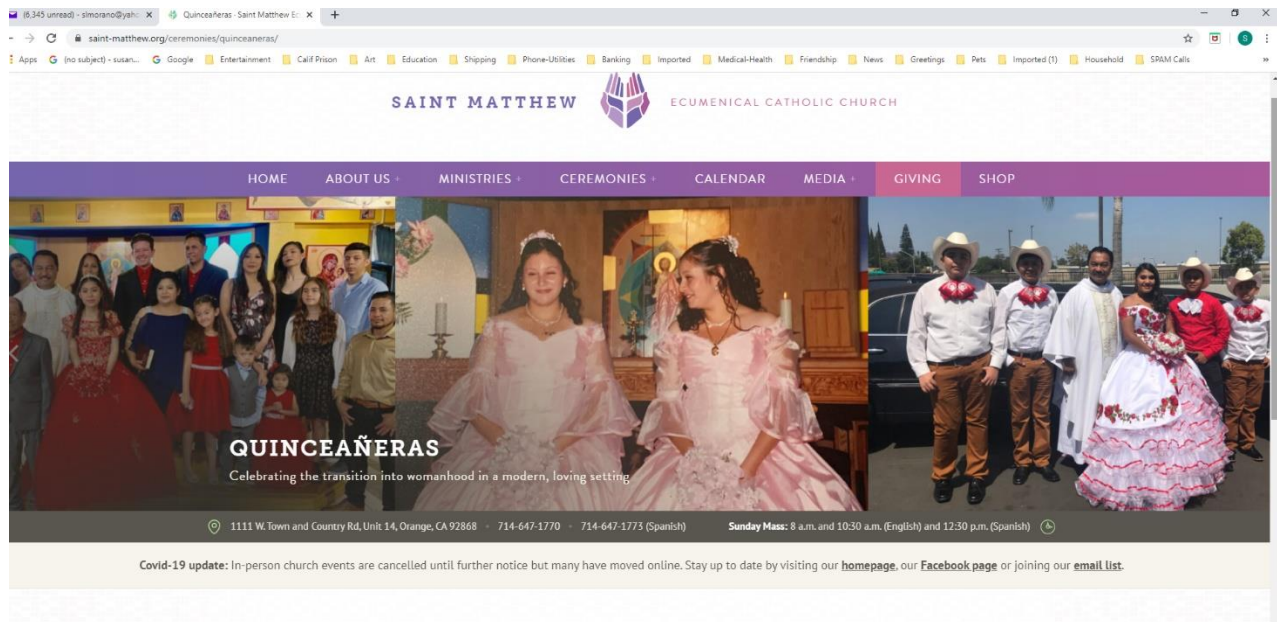

GETTING TO KNOW SAINT MATTHEW'S CLERGY



Father Arturo Querijero Ferreras

Interim Pastor & Associate to the Most Rev. Bishop Peter Hickman

Rev. Fr. Arturo Querijero Ferreras was ordained deacon by his Eminence Mario Moliner Ingles, the Apostolic Nuncio of Pope Saint John Paul II at the Archdiocese of Guatemala, C.A. Later on that same year was ordained priest by his Excellency Bishop Carlito Cenon, CICM Bishop and Prelate to Kalinga Apayao, in the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Manila, Philippines December 11, 1999. He served as a Religious Missionary to Guatemala, Central America from 1991-2003 with the Religious Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary founded in Brussels, Belgium. Started his Philosophy and Basic Theology in the Philippines then finished his MA theological studies at the Jesuit School of Theology in 1994, Mexico City. Now

he is currently serving as the Interim Pastor and Associate to the Most Rev. Bishop Peter Hickman of Saint Matthew Church, an Ecumenical Catholic Community in Orange, California (2004-present). Actively engaged in Social Justice he is ministering to a church-community, and has helped hundreds of Spanish, English and Filipino-Tagalog speaking families in and around Orange County especially the poor & the marginalized.
