Done in Area of Communication:

- Angelica developed and distributed an email blast for

- Susan compared members names and addresses in the April 2020 Church Directory with a file exported from "email blast" database. - Susan drafted a personal letter and mailed (USPS) it, along with printed copy of August 23rd email blast to eleven members, inviting them to join our email database. Susan sent 9 emails to members inviting them to sign-up on website for "email blast" announcements.

 Justin researched the existing Saint Matthew "NextDoor" account and discovered that it had been suspended. He communicated this information to Fr. Arturo and provided the NextDoor website address.

Done in Area of Website:


- Justin updates the Bible Study Media page weekly with video link. Mo. Jetty send the link after she
